A grandmother in our area, raising her young grandchildren with a very sick husband, lived in a broken down, roofless house. She provided for her family by gathering and selling firewood and washing clothes for others. She was very worried about the rainy season and placed plastic sheets on her sick husband to protect him from the wind and rain. "We were so frustrated by the rainy season because our house was not protecting us from the rain and the wind. I was so worried with my grandchildren and my husband about how we are going to survive this season." The Youth Impact Volunteers Club decided to maintain this house by raising funds and handling all the labor themselves. However, they raised more money than expected and decided to demolish the house and rebuild a new one. The grandmother shared, "The first day you came to visit my husband, God came to our house to visit us too, and end our sufferings."
